^{2.2)} Do you have any feedback regarding your seminar leader(s)?

- Encouraging students to do the work on the board themselves does not help as it wastes time and breaks up the flow of the seminar. It would be better if Yannis went through the question on the board and the students gave guidance
- I found his learning technique difficult to follow as he would often ask students to come up and show how they did the exercises on the board, which is difficult to follow with no context behind the workings out. Often students would be reluctant to participate in the seminar for the fear of getting it wrong and being embarrassed in front of each other. I would prefer if he would do the first questions on the board showing how to work it out exactly with the correct steps and then to ask students to participate rather than picking on people. Especially the fact that seminar participation is part of the coursework grade it put student in a difficult position.
